European Commission and EIB sign Memorandum of Understanding for co-operation in agriculture and rural development

Commissioner for Agriculture and Rural Development Dacian Cioloş and Vice President of the European Investment Bank (EIB) Wilhelm Molterer signed on 15 July 2014 a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the European Commission and the EIB for co-operation in agriculture and rural development in 2014-2020. The first of its kind in the field of agriculture, this MoU paves the way for common initiatives by both institutions, so as to stimulate rural development and boost the utilisation of financial instruments supported by rural development funds. START- Danube Region Project Fund

START - Danube Region Project Fund is a new pilot initiative of the EUSDR and provides Seed Money for the development and implementation of Danube Region projects. Seed Money means that beneficiaries receive an early pre-financing in order to cover the project expenses from the beginning. This helps especially small organisations with limited resources to START their projects. Deadline: 17 September 2014. More...

COSME - Sustainable transnational tourism products

The main objective of this call is to strengthen competitiveness of the European tourism sector as well as its sustainability by encouraging diversification of the supply of tourist services and products. The project proposals should aim at promoting sustainable transnational tourism products (such as e.g. routes, itineraries, trails, tourism offer...) in sport or wellness activities in relation to one of the following types of tourism: coastal or maritime or mountain or rural tourism. Deadline: 7 October 2014. More...

<u>Consultation on The urban dimension of EU policies – key</u> <u>features of an EU Urban Agenda</u>

Europe continues to be faced with challenges related to the economy, the climate, the environment, and society at large. Most of these challenges have a strong urban dimension. But although cities' role for economic, social and cultural development, and their potential for a more resource efficient habitat, have long been recognised, the policy response at European and national level has been slow and piecemeal, with many but poorly integrated sectoral

<u>Consultation on the EU Strategy for the Alpine Region</u> (EUSALP)

The EU Macro-regional Strategy for the Alpine Region aims to bring a new impetus for cooperation and investment to the benefit of all involved: States, regions, civil society stakeholders and, above all, European citizens. It will build on a long tradition of co-operation in the Alps, and will seek to complement, rather than duplicate existing co-operation structures. This also aims to ensure that this Region remains one of the most attractive areas in Europe, taking better advantage of its assets and seizing its opportunities for sustainable and innovative development in a European context. <u>Consultation on the Safety of Tourism Accommodation</u> <u>Services</u>

The objective of this consultation is to gather input and quantifiable evidence from all relevant parties with an aim to evaluate fundamental aspects related to tourism accommodation safety. The consultation will be open to 30 November 2014. More...

<u>First Horizon 2020 Work Programme update – launch of FTI and innovation prizes</u>

The Fast Track to Innovation (FTI) pilot is the only measure in Horizon 2020 that provides funding for close to market, business driven projects, that is open to proposals in any area of technology or application. This thematic openness – combined with the possibility for all kinds of innovation actors to work together and deliver innovation onto the market and/or into society – should nurture trans-disciplinary and cross-sector cooperation.
